An Open Letter, Calling for Prayer and Care of Our Immigrant Neighbors

To all those who will listen, a call to prayer and care for our immigrant neighbors:

June 19, 2018

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

On the day I write this, the heat index is 107 degrees, a sweltering temperature so high that none of us want to be outside of the air conditioning. I know of a relatively young person who today went on a walk across the town and had to get help going back home, because the heat was too intense. In the summer here, we don't go outside unless we have to. And yet, in the extreme heat of the desert, thousands of asylum seekers have walked across the so-called Devil's Highway (named this because so many people are robbed, killed, raped, forced into modern day slavery, and die of the elements along the way) along our Southern border, trying to enter the United States by any means necessary, many of them not even knowing the legal process. The only reason they attempt this, oftentimes with their children, is because the road is safer than what they left. And yet, when many of them reach the US Border, the parents are separated from their children, because of our current policy.

Tonight, when I put my children to sleep in their respective rooms, I will kiss them and pray that they would love God and neighbor, telling them that the love of God in their hearts will change them and change the world. And then I will leave, with a pretty good knowledge they will be there when I return in the morning. Imagine a world where you have braved a fierce heat and a devilish road, only to come to your place of hope where your children were then forcibly taken away from you. For those who don't get their children back, this may cause death from a broken heart. For those who do get their children back, this may cause outrage and anger. For the next generation of immigrants, who knows what it may cause.

In the midst of this crisis, Attorney General Jeff Sessions, a fellow United Methodist lay person, has quoted Romans 13, which says that we should obey the laws of the land and that the authorities have been ordained by God. The context of Romans 13 is in a book governed mainly by love. Romans 12 says, "Contribute to the needs of God's people, and welcome strangers into your home." Later on in Romans 13 Paul writes, "Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law." Romans does not say anything about separating children from parents, and no proof-texting can make this a moral action. As Martin Luther King Jr. said, in opposing our Jim Crowe era laws, "We have a moral obligation to oppose an unjust law."

As Wesleyan Christians, we discern through Scripture, yes, but we also use Tradition, Experience, and Reason. Any loving parent's experience and reason will tell her our separation policy is not Godly. And our Tradition speaks for itself (See Social Principles ¶ 165A, D. and Resolution #6028). Furthermore, on the basis of our Tradition, several clergy have filed charges against Sessions on the basis of his "dissemination of doctrines contrary to the established standards of doctrines." (¶ 2702.3) All partisan politics aside, here is an easy opportunity for us to point at what it means to be Christian, at this time. I won't belabor the current laws or talk more about our presidential Administration. Both of these are a symptom of a much larger issue - that we have forgotten to see love as the fulfillment of the Law. We have not heard the cry of the needy, and we have not loved our neighbor as our self.

Using the attached litany, written by the NCCUMC Congregational and Family Task Force on Immigration, I encourage you to be in prayer with us, for our immigrant neighbors, especially for the 2,000 children who have been taken from their parents. In perspective, our whole Conference received 2,378 new members by Profession of Faith in 2016. And while we may never meet one of the 2,000 children who have been separated from an equally large community of parents, we must recognize their sacredness as children of God. Let us remember them, lament for them, and begin an inner transformation which can overflow into our communities. Let us be transformed by God's Love and welcome, which have gone before us, go with us, and will be here after us.
